From the Desk of Fr. Pascual

15th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Who is my neighbor...?"

A scholar of the law poses a question to Jesus who is his neighbor. We can surmise that being a scholar of the law he knows every detail of the laws they have and can intelligently interpret them. He tries to test Jesus about laws and Jesus' answer is illustrated in a parable known as the "Parable of the Good Samaritan." The Parable is one of the most well known stories in Sacred Scripture. It helps us to understand what it truly means to be a neighbor to anyone and for everyone.

We may know very well the laws or commands of God. That is to love the Lord, our God, and our neighbor with all our heart, with all our being, with all our strength and with all our mind as ourselves. It is so clear that we don't need further interpretation to understand it. Like the scholar of the law, we are very familiar with this and can easily memorize it. We don't need to be a scholar to know this since it is self-explanatory.

The core of the story is the challenge of living the laws presented to us. It is easy to pray for those who suffer and those who are in need. It is easy to have feelings of empathy especially the poor and oppressed. But what do we do for them? In what ways have we really shown that we are loving neighbors to others? We feel so much comfort when we are comforted by someone we don't know. We oftentimes are recipients of compassion by people we haven't met. But have we also done our part to be givers of love and compassion? Have we really lived what Jesus is teaching us in the parable? Jesus makes it clear that to be a neighbor is not only to be a person next door. As followers of Christ, we are expected to know the law not only by memory but by heart.
